

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Baxter Mutual Water Co.

Our water system failed to monitor as required for drinking water standards during the final quarter of 2010 and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis (California Code of Regulations Title 22 Section 64423). Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the fourth quarter, Oct-Dec 2010, we did not complete testing for Bacteriological contamination and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do. The February sample/test was OK.

What happened? What is being done?

We take one sample each quarter and get AVEK to do a Bacteriological test. The last quarter of 2010 we missed the sample/testing. The first quarter 2011 test was done in February and was OK. We are hiring a professional to take over this task.
